Job: Worthington Farms Drainage Improvement Project

Location: 9th City Council District

Project Introduction

Existing drainage infrastructure within the Worthington Farms subdivision consists of roadside ditches with driveway culverts and a minimal amount of a stormwater drainage system. Portions of the neighborhood are very flat and can experience standing water within the ditches, and some ditches have overly steep side slopes.

This project involves developing solutions for expanding the stormwater drainage system, improving the ditches to alleviate standing water, and better conveying stormwater runoff away from the neighborhood to adequate outfalls.

Field Investigations:

Survey work is being performed by Cardinal Civil Resources, RK&K, Accumark, and McKinzie-Snyder.

Richmonders may notice vehicles and survey crews in neighborhoods collecting data, locating utilities, and investigating drainage conditions and concerns.

Easement Acquisition:

Temporary and permanent easements will be necessary for the Worthington Farms Drainage Improvement Project to be constructed.

Utility Relocations:

In order for the Worthington Farms Drainage Improvement Project to be constructed, it is anticipated that many utility relocations will be required.

These relocations will make room for the new stormwater drainage system to be installed.

Project Duration:

This project is currently in design.

Before construction begins, a letter will be sent to adjacent property owners to notify the neighborhood of the construction start date and details.

This flyer will also be updated with additional information as the project progresses.
